

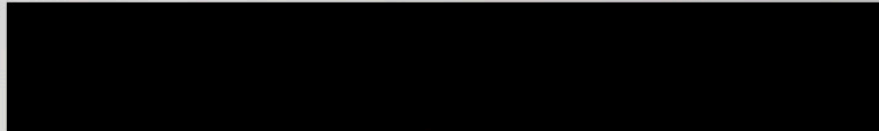

**SUBJECT:** Temporary Duty (TDY) Solicitation – Del Rio, Texas

The United States Border Patrol (USBP) continues to experience critical shortages of frontline personnel due to the rising encounters of individuals attempting to enter the United States without proper authorization along the Southwest Border. In addition, the Port of Del Rio has been temporarily closed to allow CBP to respond to the security needs presented by an influx of migrants into Del Rio. This closure will advance and protect national interests and help ensure the safety of the traveling public, commercial traffic, as well as CBP employees and facilities.

The Office of Field Operations (OFO) has been requested to provide immediate support to the Del Rio, TX area of responsibility (AOR) for a period of up to 30-days, with a possibility of extension. Due to the dynamic nature of the situation, individual duties may vary, but should be expected to consist of: assisting with the intake of arriving noncitizens, safety and oversight of individuals in custody, case processing, and/or port hardening and physical security.

This TDY may require working various shifts, holidays, weekends, alternative work schedules, and overtime. Additionally, deployed officers can expect to be lodging in austere conditions and will likely not be in hotels. Officers are expected to be able to perform all assigned shifts and duties and must be able to deploy on short notice (i.e., within 8-12 hours of selection notification). Work locations are subject to change during the duration of the TDY and will be determined by the hosting port of entry (POE) or USBP sector based upon dynamic staffing needs. While not required, employees certified in Mobile Field Force (MFF) are strongly encouraged to apply. Furthermore, knowledge in case processing, or Haitian Creole language are also preferred but not mandatory.

**Who May Apply:** CBP Supervisors and CBP Officers assigned to all Ports of Entry within the San Diego Field office may apply. Interested candidates must be in good standing and have completed Post-Academy training and probationary requirements. Must have a valid government credit card.

All selected personnel must be prepared to travel on **Sunday, September 19, 2021**. Please ensure good contact information is provided.
