Dear Congressman McCaul:

Thank you for your recent letter of October 27, 2021, regarding Voice of America (VOA) employee Ms. Setareh Sieg. Your letter raises concerns about Ms. Sieg, and I appreciate hearing those concerns. I also am cognizant of Ms. Sieg's status as a career agency employee, and I want to ensure that her employment remains appropriately insulated from political pressures. Indeed, I am especially sensitive to that issue as this agency emerges from the shadow of a period of substantial turmoil, much of which surrounded concern about the apparent politicization of various personnel decisions. I certainly hope you and I agree about each of these background considerations.

In light of your letter and the context of the above, I have directed that my staff forward your concerns to the agency's Office of Human Resources (OHR) with instructions to consider the content of your letter and to take any appropriate investigative and other actions, in accordance with all applicable laws and regulations. If you or your staff have additional, factual information that would help inform OHR efforts, please provide that information to me, and I will direct my staff to convey it for their professional consideration.

The agency, as appropriate, will share with your office any further action that results in this matter.
