METHODOLOGY



This Counterpolling™ survey of **1,200 Registered Voters** was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on **September 22-23, 2022**. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc.

Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 2.8 percentage points.




- Flfty-eight percent (58%) of voters prefer to live in a community where people are allowed to own guns.
 - This is up from 47% in May, following the Uvalde shooting and consistent with long-term trends.
 - Thirty percent (30%) prefer a community where guns are outlawed
 - Most Republicans (80%) would prefer to live in a community where guns are allowed.
 - Most Democrats (53%) would prefer a community where guns are outlawed.
- Forty-five percent (45%) say that they or someone in their immediate family owns a gun.
 - This includes 56% of those in rural areas, but just 35% of those in the largest cities.
 - Fifty-two percent (52%) of union members live in a gun-owning household.
