### **METHODOLOGY**



This Counterpolling™ survey of **1,200 Registered Voters** was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on **December 6-8, 2022**. Field work for the survey was
conducted by RMG Research, Inc.

Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is **+/- 2.8 percentage points.**

### **KEY FINDINGS**




- Overall, 62% of voters would prefer to live in a community where people are allowed to own guns.
  - Just 25% would prefer a community where guns are outlawed.
  - Republicans, by an 84% to 12% margin, prefer a community where guns are allowed. Democrats are evenly divided.
  - The overall number who prefer a community where guns are allowed dipped to 47% following the Uvalde shootings but has since rebounded to a level consistent with the long-term trend.
- Seventy-one percent (71%) of voters say there are positive benefits to allowing private gun ownership.
  - This includes majorities of both Republicans (86%) and Democrats (59%).
- Forty-six percent (46%) say gun laws in their area are generally not strict enough.
  - Twenty-four percent (24%) say they are too strict.
  - By a narrow margin of 34% to 29%, Republicans say gun laws are too strict.
  - By a large margin of 67% to 16%, Democrats say that gun laws aren't strict enough.




