



### Methodology: polling

#### J.L. Partners polled 500 Republicans nationwide

- Fieldwork took place 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2024
- Sample of 500 Republicans collected online
- Quotas were added to ensure representative data: on gender, age, education, race and region
- The sample was weighted back to the population using data on the same variables: on gender, age, education, race and region
- 3-minute duration
- Margin of error: 4.4%


#### Key findings summary

Republicans nationwide are highly concerned by Big Tech and any efforts to undermine Trump's agenda in trying to restrain Big Tech. Republican voters also call for more accountability and expect legislators to stand up to Big Tech. Taking any position to the contrary would clearly be at significant odds with the Republican Party's grassroots supporters.

#### Key points:


- Republicans overwhelmingly agree with calls by Donald Trump to break up Big Tech Companies with 8 in 10 agreeing. Only 2 in 10 Republicans disagree.
- 8 in 10 Republicans are either very or somewhat concerned about the power and influence of Big Tech companies.
- Half of the Republicans surveyed are very concerned about "Deep State" government officials undermining Trump's agenda if reelected. Overall, more than eight in ten Republicans (82%) have some level of concern.
- Republicans are concerned about organizations like CEI working to undermine Trump's agenda with 8 in 10 saying they are either very or somewhat concerned.
- 86% of Republicans say it is important for FTC commissioners to stand up to powerful companies and 86% five in every six Republicans agree that Republicans on the FTC should have strong records on opposing Big Tech monopolies.
- Overall 62% of Republicans oppose Sen. McConnell's selection of Melissa Holyoak with just 39% in support. Close to 8 in 10 Republicans (78%) would be concerned if their Senator voted to confirm Holyoak.


# Eight in ten Republicans agree with calls to break up Big Tech companies, with agreement across all types of Republican

Do you agree or disagree with calls by President Trump and others to break up Big Tech companies?




#### Eight in ten Republicans are somewhat or very concerned about the power and influence of Big Tech companies

How concerned, if at all, are you about the power and influence of Big Tech companies?




# More than eight in ten Republicans (82%) are concerned that Deep State officials will undermine Trump's agenda

How concerned, if at all, are you that "Deep State" government officials will work to undermine President Trump's agenda if he is elected to a second term?




# Three in four Republicans are concerned that bureaucrats would try to undermine a Trump crackdown on Big Tech

How concerned, if at all, would you be if Deep State, government bureaucrats try to undermine President Trump's fight against Big Tech if he wins a second term?




## Eight in ten Republicans are somewhat or very concerned about the role of organizations like CEI undermining Trump's agenda

How concerned are you, if at all, about organizations like CEI working to undermine President Trump's agenda?




## Role of the FTC



# Almost nine in ten Republicans say it is important for FTC commissioners to be willing to stand up to powerful companies


How important is it to you, if at all, that FTC commissioners are willing to stand up to powerful companies and support Big Tech accountability?



Q6. The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) is a five-member federal agency with the power to rein in Big Tech monopolies. Under President Trump, the FTC launched a historic antitrust lawsuit against Facebook to hold the company accountable. This lawsuit was praised by conservatives but opposed by Big Tech lobbyists and organizations like the CEI.

## Close to nine in ten Republicans (86%) say that Republicans on the FTC should have strong records of opposing tech monopolies


Do you agree or disagree that Republicans on the FTC should have strong records of opposing Big Tech monopolies?
