Dear Secretary Becerra:

In June 2021, I along with four other members of the Senate Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs, sent you a letter requesting records related to Anthony Fauci and the origins of COVID-19.<sup>1</sup> In response, the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) produced approximately 4,000 pages of records containing Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) redactions.<sup>2</sup> As you are aware, Congressional oversight is not subject to FOIA redactions. In September 2021, my office identified approximately 400 pages of priority records that we requested to review unredacted.<sup>3</sup> Despite your own assertion that I am "absolutely entitled to the information that by law a member of the Senate or the House should get," nearly three years after my initial request, the complete contents of approximately 50 pages of priority records are still hidden under HHS's heavy redactions.<sup>4</sup>

During a March 14, 2024 hearing before the Senate Committee on Finance, I asked you "[w]hy haven't you turned [the unredacted 50 priority pages] over to us," despite your legal obligation.<sup>5</sup> I further stated, "if you're withholding information from Congress . . . at minimum you should be providing me a privilege log justifying the reason you're withholding this information."<sup>6</sup> As I stated during the hearing, HHS has never provided my office a written privilege log identifying the exact privilege it is asserting for each redaction on the approximately 50 pages of priority records.<sup>7</sup>

It is well past time for HHS to meet its legal obligation and produce, without redactions, the approximately 50 pages of priority records my office identified in 2021. You previously testified that I am "absolutely entitled" to that information.<sup>8</sup> Congress and the American people expect you to fulfill your responsibility and live up to your word.

As I mentioned at the March 14, 2024 hearing, I request HHS provide a detailed privilege log for the approximately 50 pages of priority records listed in the enclosure. For each redaction contained in those records, I expect HHS to identify the specific privilege that HHS believes prevents it from removing the redaction. If HHS cannot identify a valid privilege, those records should be produced to me without redactions immediately. Please provide this information by April 8, 2024. In addition, at the March 14, 2024 hearing I requested that you make yourself available for a phone call as soon as possible to discuss the steps HHS will take to respond to the June 2021 letter as well as other outstanding requests. I expect to schedule this phone call or inperson meeting by the week of April 8, 2024.
