Dear Requester:

This letter is the final response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request to U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), dated 1/12/2026. You have requested records pertaining to investigation conducted by U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement concerning allegations of immigration fraud involving a member of Congress marrying a relative from 2016-2021.

ICE has determined that the information you requested is being withheld in full pursuant to Title 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(7)(A). Disclosure of any responsive records at this time could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings. FOIA Exemption 7(A) applies to records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes when their release could disrupt such proceedings.

Please note that, even if Exemption 7(A) were to no longer apply, other FOIA exemptions—such as Exemptions 6, 7(C), 7(D), 7(E), and/or 7(F)—may still protect certain information from disclosure.

You have a right to appeal the above withholding determination. Should you wish to do so, you must send your appeal and a copy of this letter, within 90 days of the date of this letter following the procedures outlined in the DHS FOIA regulations at 6 C.F.R. Part 5 § 5.8. You may submit your appeal through the SecureRelease Portal (preferred) or via regular mail to:

Your envelope and letter should be marked “FOIA Appeal.” Copies of the FOIA and DHS

regulations are available at www.dhs.gov/foia.

Provisions of FOIA allow DHS to charge for processing fees, up to \$25, unless you seek a waiver of fees. In this instance, because the cost is below the \$25 minimum, there is no charge. Additionally, you have a right to right to seek dispute resolution services from the Office of Government Information Services (OGIS) which mediates disputes between FOIA requesters and Federal agencies as a non-exclusive alternative to litigation. If you are requesting access to your own records (which is considered a Privacy Act request), you should know that OGIS does not have the authority to handle requests made under the Privacy Act of 1974.
